According to Ecclesiastes, "For everything there is an appointed time, and an appropriate time for every activity on earth...a time to keep silent and a time to speak." In re-reading this section it occurred to me that some "times" just happen to us, they are out of our control. Years ago, I read a very helpful book by John Maxwell, called, Developing the Leader Within You. He tells the story of a little boy who attended his first symphonic concert. It was a dream come true for him. His favorite instrument was the cymbals. The first loud, dramatic crash of those brass disks won him over. He noticed, however, as the evening went on that the cymbal player stood motionless much of the time while the other musicians played. After the concert, his parents took him back stage to meet some of the players. The little fellow immediately sought out the cymbalist. "Say mister," he said sincerely, "how much do you need to know to play the cymbals?" The musician laughed and answered, "You don't have to know much at all, you only have to know when."

After almost 18 months as interim president of CO, I can tell you the time is now. At every level of leadership

you can feel it. Everyone is leaning forward. We have been around long enough to see the true value of this ministry and we are enthusiastic about its potential to impact lives for Christ. But stepping into the future is not easy. Erwin McManus, author and pastor, writes: "The future is coming whether we like it or not. You can fight it or you can fight for it." God is changing the lives of coaches through Bible studies and Marriage Retreats. If you put a coach on a mission, athletes of all kinds will have unexpected "near-life experiences." Picturing that makes me want to get the word out.

In the same book mentioned above, Maxwell observes that during World War II, the demand for parachutes was high. Making them was mind numbing and strenuous—long hours b e n d i n g over sewing m a c h i n e s, stitching and m a n a g i n g large amounts of bland fabric that resulted in a blob of material. But every morning the workers

were told that each stitch was part of a lifesaving operation. They were asked to think as they sewed that each parachute might be the one worn by their brothers, sons, or husbands. That made all the difference.

Part of what it means to fight for the future in CO is seeing faces behind every X and O. God sees every kid that dons practice attire and joins the squad as someone special. Each one has a story. Many do not know that God can change their world. But then they meet a coach who knows and loves God and nothing remains the same.

The truth is every conversation that I have ever had with anyone associated with CO, gets it. They are "raving fans." As fans, let's invite others into the wonder of this ministry and rock the stadium a little.

Culture Shock!

What has happened to our culture? Are you shocked and discouraged with how quickly our culture has degraded to a level out of control? Do you find yourself asking, "At this rate, what kind of culture will my children and grandchildren grow up in?" If you wonder how a Christian will cope in a culture that is not only ignorant of our faith, but increasingly hostile to it, you're not alone and you're not paranoid. Our culture is changing in front of our very eyes. We are being invaded. Not primarily by physical forces, or political forces, but by spiritual forces at war with biblical values.

For most of its nearly 250 years, America has provided a welcome home for those with a Christian worldview. Our government, laws, and institutions—including schools—have made it easy, even desirous, for Christians to thrive, live out their faith, and share it with others. Especially in our schools, children learned right and wrong from teachers who shared Christian values and taught them daily. But no longer.

Increasingly, students and faculty alike—who live for the Lord—find themselves in the minority. Their faith and their morals have become objects of scorn and ridicule. Peer pressure threatens to coerce them into conformity with the world around them. Such a cultural shift may be new to *us*, but it is not new to history or to the Lord. In fact, Scripture gives people an insightful role model for any age—from pimples to wrinkles—on how to handle hostile territory. His name is Daniel.

This coming fall, we'll be studying his life and the life of his three friends, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, better known as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. Due to Ju-

dah's persistent disobedience, the Babylonians invaded their land, took these four young teens as captives, and removed them from their families. King Nebuchadnezzar did everything possible
